Endowed Programs

- **Dorothy L. Lougee Nursing Assistant Program** provides support to certified nursing assistant students. The program was endowed by the generosity of Mr. V. B. Lougee.
- **James A. Rousseau II Minority Male Mentoring Program** provides academic, social and motivational support to minority male students. The program also provides practical knowledge of budgeting, investing, savings and other life skills.
- **Montgomery Tucker Fund** awards grants from the fund to faculty to further their education/professional development. Inspired by the dedication of Forsyth Tech's faculty members, this fund was endowed by Mrs. Mary Tucker.
