Automotive Systems students achieved a pass rate of 100 percent on the national Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) Toyota T-TEN certification test. The national average for first-time T-TEN students taking this exam is 30 percent. SECU Foundation awarded \$18,000 to Forsyth Tech's Workforce Development Program. College partnered with the Forsyth Tech Foundation to launch the Mazie Woodruff Scholarship Fund, created to help eliminate barriers and increase literacy for students. For the second year in a row, a team of Nanotechnology students placed in the top 10 in the National Science Foundation competition. College received the Million Hour Safety Award from the North Carolina Department of Labor for the second year in a row. Forsyth Tech joins forces with five other colleges/universities in Winston-Salem to form Entrepreneurial Grant Initiative/partnership. The college pledged \$300,000 in private funds donated through the Forsyth Tech Foundation. College implemented the Forsyth Tech Works! Program, giving employees eight paid hours of time off to give back in their communities. Diesel and Heavy Equipment student won 1st place in North Carolina Trucking Association's Technology & Maintenance Council's (TMC) NC Student Technician Competition. U.S. Department of Education awards \$499,856 grant to provide childcare subsidies for students at Forsyth Tech College distributed 100 refurbished laptops through its Neighborhood Empowerment Through Technology (NETT) program. In 2017, Forsyth Tech became the first community college in NC to participate in a collaborative project with UNC-C and NC A&T for the Carolina Cyber Defense Scholarship supported by the CyberCorps(R) Scholarship for Service (SFS) program. In 2017, Forsyth Tech was awarded NSF funding for its first GenCyber Camp, and in 2018 received funding for two GenCyber Camps. The Forsyth Tech Foundation celebrated the conclusion of its "Pathways to Possibilities" capital campaign in 2018 after raising more than \$20Million to support the work of the college. Recent graduates of the Architecture and Interior Design Programs, Daniel Turick and Rachael Due, teamed up to design a therapeutic tree house for Amos Cottage. Interior Design students placed first, second, and third in 2017 and second and third in 2018 in the East Carolina National Kitchen and Bath Design Competition. Both the Computer Engineering Technology (CET-one of two in the state) and Electrical Engineering Technology (EET-one of three in the state) Programs are ABET accredited. In 2018 M. Todd Shoaf and Herb Burns traveled to Lviv, Ukraine to present at a lecture series and meet with the School of Architecture to sign an agreement for sharing design and architecture student resources for education. Later in the year, a Ukrainian delegation visited Forsyth Tech. Architecture graduate and adjunct faculty member, Alan Shelton, opens MIXXER, Winston-Salem's first maker space open to the community and students. The Interior Design program collaborated with Habitat ReStore for a designer day in September 2018 and are planning future collaborations in Spring 2019.
