Important Reminders...

- 1. The CNAI Policy Book has been revised. This includes important policy updates such as classroom dress code, absentee/makeup form, Appendix A, Appendix B, and Testing skills. If you have not received an updated copy, please let me know so that I can get this information to you. Also, be sure that you are reviewing these policies on the first day of class.
- 2. Please remember that the classrooms and labs MUST be cleaned at the end of each day. At the end of each class day, please make sure that the following is happening:
 - All surfaces are wiped down with Sani-wipes
 - All supplies are put back in their appropriate places - in the supply closet or designated places
 - All counters are cleared off the only items left on counters are gloves and hand soap
 - All beds are made with manikins in them if manikin is left on counter, it must be covered with a flat sheet
 - All supplies in supply closet are put away in their designated areas
 - All trash is removed from the room, tied up, and placed outside for collection
- 3. CastleBranch is in full force and students are working hard to complete the requirements to register for CNAI, CNAII, Phlebotomy, and EKG classes! Part of this process requires that students submit their immunizations (including TB skin tests) prior to class registration. Did You Know?

- 1. Having students write their name on popsicle sticks on the first day of class allows you to randomly assign students to practice groups and activities to promote teamwork and prevent classroom cliques!

- Click on the appropriate modules and at the top of the page select the tab "*test*."
- Go to the right hand side of the screen and select "Multiple Choice" under the "Question Types" and "Both" under the "Start With" and then select the maximum amount of terms available.
- Then select "Create New Test" and this should re-format your study guide to a multiple choice practice quiz.
