Admissions Information

Dental Hygiene is a selective enrollment program beginning each fall. Resources such as clinical facilities and faculty, as well as approval standards, limit the number of applicants accepted to the program to 12 students each year. *One seat is reserved for a 2009 high school graduate. Currently enrolled high school applicants will only compete for the seat with other high school applicants.* Dental Hygiene is a two-year, associate degree program and all applicants must meet minimum requirements to be considered for admission. **Please note, however, that meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission.**

When applicants have completed all of the minimum requirements, they must meet with an admissions counselor for a Dental Hygiene Minimum Admissions Requirement (MAR) review. This must be completed by the deadline date stated above. Qualified applicants will be ranked based on criteria listed in this packet. Applicants not admitted to the program must re-apply and complete a new MAR if they wish to be considered for the following year's class. *The yearly deadline for Dental Hygiene will be March 30th, however, should this date fall on a weekend, the deadline will be the Thursday prior to the 30th.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

The following steps must be completed by March 30, 2009 for the fall 2009 program.

- ___ 1. Complete the Forsyth Tech application.
- ___ 2. Attend a mandatory Health Information Session. It is highly recommended that you attend an on campus session. However, if that is not possible the session is also available to be viewed online at www.forsythtech.edu/healthtech/index.html.
- ___ 3. Complete placement testing if required by the Admissions Office.
- ___ 4. Have an official high school transcript or GED scores mailed to the Admissions Office. (Official transcripts must be sent directly from the school to Forsyth Tech and have the school's seal or original signature).
- ___ 5. Have official transcripts from all colleges or schools attended since high school sent to the Admissions Office. These will be reviewed for possible transfer credit.
- ___ 6. Meet with an Admissions Counselor after completion of the minimum requirements on page 2. This must be done by the above stated deadline. **This meeting is required.** The Admissions Office hours for the MAR review are 8:00 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. Mon. – Thur. and 8:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. Fridays. The review is done on a walk-in basis and no appointment is necessary. **Surry Community College applicants are not required to complete a MAR review with an Admissions Counselor at Forsyth Tech, and may only apply at one school.**

MINIMUM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Applicants not meeting these minimum scores should enroll in the appropriate developmental course(s). All developmental courses must be completed by the deadline date. A college level English composition or algebra course with a grade of "C" or higher will be used to waive the tests once the transcript(s) has been received and reviewed. Likewise, acceptable SAT/ACT scores within the past five years may also waive some of the tests.

2. Algebra ,Biology and Chemistry Competency

Applicants must have completed a high school algebra, biology and chemistry course. If one of the courses were not completed at the high school level, an applicant must complete the course(s) at the college level. There is no age limitation on the high school or college level courses being used to meet pre-requisite requirements.

3. “C” or Better Policy

Applicants must earn a “C” or better in all general education courses attempted to become eligible for the program. Applicants with a “D” or “F” in a related course (listed on pg. 3) as of the stated deadline will not be eligible to be considered for admission to the Dental Hygiene program. If the grades of “D” or “F” are earned after acceptance to the program, the course must be repeated and a “C” or higher earned before the student will be allowed to enroll in the program. Failure to remove the grade of “D” or “F” will result in the loss of admission to the Dental Hygiene program.

4. Minimum Admissions Review (MAR) * NEW REQUIREMENT*****

After **completion** of the minimum requirements and the application process, applicants **must** meet with an admissions counselor to complete the Minimum Admissions Review (MAR) form in order to be considered for admissions to the program. This step must be completed by March 30, 2009 for the fall 2009 program. Applicants for the program will not be considered for admission until this step is completed. **Surry applicants are not required to complete a MAR review with a Forsyth Tech Admissions Counselor.**

RANKING PROCESS

When all minimum requirements have been met, qualified applicants are ranked using a point system. As this is a selective enrollment program, it is in the student's best interest to achieve as many ranking points as possible. The components of the ranking system include the following items:

1. Related Courses

Points are awarded for specific course grades completed by the deadline. Grade points are valued as follows: A= 4 points, B= 3 points and C= 2 points. These points are then multiplied by the credit hours for each course. For example, English 111 (3 credit hours) with a grade of "B" (3 points) gives a student 9 total points for that course. **All 2009 HS graduates will be ranked using the overall weighted GPA and grades in specific high school courses. Grade points are valued as follows: Honors/AP courses – A=5pts., B=4pts., C=3pts. Standard courses – A=4pts., B=3pts., C=2pts. High school courses will only be considered for points if the applicant is a 2009 HS graduate.**

Related academic courses and approved substitutions are listed below. Only courses completed by the deadline will be used for ranking. Courses must be completed with a "C" or higher.

2. Additional Points: Must be submitted at time of MAR or by deadline.

Points will be awarded for the completion of the following. Please note, these are not requirements for admission to the program. Appropriate documentation must be submitted for points to be awarded.

6 points	Completion of an <u>Allied Health</u> related bachelor's degree.
5 points	Completion of a <u>Non-Allied Health</u> bachelor's degree.
4 points	Completion of an <u>Allied Health</u> related associate's degree.
3 points	Completion of a <u>Non-Allied Health</u> associate's degree.
2 points	Completion of an <u>Allied Health</u> related diploma.
1 point	Completion of a <u>Non-Allied Health</u> diploma.
5 points	Licensed Paramedic
2 points	Licensed EMT
2 points	CNA II

- 2 points 1 yr PT health field work experience
- 4 points 1 yr FT health field work experience
- 4 points CDA certification
- 2 points Current dental student

3. Total Points for Ranking

Adding together the grade points and related experience points will determine the total score. Students with the highest point total will be accepted. In the event of a tie, the **completion** date of the admissions file not the date of the MAR will be the determining factor. An alternate list will also be developed. Alternates will only be accepted if a student originally accepted, declines their seat. Applicants not admitted to the program must re-apply, **and** complete a new MAR if they wish to be considered for the following year's class.
