Graduates of this program are eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN).

Application Process

- Submit an application indicating LPN to RN Transition Option.
- Request official transcripts from high school and all post-secondary schools attended.
- Meet required program course prerequisites.
- Meet required test scores for ADN admission or show competency with a grade of "C" or better in college level English or math.
- Must attend a mandatory nursing information session.
- Completion of the TEAS once notified of eligibility.

The process for selection of students entering NUR 214 (LPN to RN Transition) is based upon the selective admission criteria currently being used for ADN applicants.

 Fall 2011 Admission March 15, 2011

Criteria for the LPN to RN Transition Option

- Unrestricted licensure as an LPN in the state of North Carolina.
- Six months full-time work experience as an LPN.
- Meet all admission requirements for the ADN program with the EXCEPTION of CNA I certification.

Must have completed PSY 150 and PSY 241, and BIO 165 and BIO 166 with a grade of "C" or better. These courses are prerequisites for NUR 189.

Please note that BIO 165 and BIO 166 or the equivalent courses become outdated after 5 years. **These courses must be repeated to be eligible for this option.**
