4. ARTICULATED COURSES FAQs

Below are questions frequently asked by students and parents about Articulated Courses:

WHAT IS AN ARTICULATED COURSE?

An “Articulated Course” is a high school course that is essentially the same as a course offered at Forsyth Tech. This means that, if a student takes that course in high school and receives a B or better, Forsyth Tech will give the student advanced standing credit for the course when the student enrolls at Forsyth Tech. By taking articulated courses, a student can earn credits and get a Forsyth Tech degree sooner.

DOES THE STUDENT HAVE TO DO ANYTHING ELSE?

Yes. The student must also pass the VOCATS test with a score of 80 or above.

WHAT IS AN EXAMPLE OF AN ARTICULATED COURSE?

Early Childhood Education II in **High School** = Early Childhood Education (EDU 119) at **Forsyth Tech**

This means that, if a student takes Early Childhood Education II in high school and gets a B or better and scores a raw VOCATS score of 80 or above, that student can get advanced standing credit for Early Childhood Education (EDU 119) at Forsyth Tech. This is just one example. There are many, many Articulated Courses available. A complete list of Articulated Courses is in the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County High School Registration Handbook.

IS THERE ANY COST FOR ARTICULATED COURSES?

No. They are simply high school courses that can, if the student chooses, be used for advanced standing credit at Forsyth Tech (or any other North Carolina community college). So they cost nothing, but can save the student on tuition by allowing the student to complete community college degree requirements sooner.

HOW DO I KNOW WHICH ARTICULATED COURSES TO TAKE?

Talk to your high school counselor. He or she can advise you on the right courses to take to more quickly achieve your academic or career goals.



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
