Day 6 - London - Saturday, May 20 Breakfast & Day Briefing Day Trip to Stonehenge

Stonehenge - The World Heritage Site of Stonehenge is one of the most iconic prehistoric monuments in Europe. Built in the late Neolithic period around 2,500 BC, the construction of this imposing and fascinating stone circle is shrouded in mystery – what was it actually built for? And how did the Neolithic people build such a wonder using simple tools and equipment?

Day 7 - London/Ghent - Sunday, May 21 Breakfast & Day Briefing

Transfer to Milton Keynes (approx. 30 mins) Bletchley Park - Bletchley Park, British government cryptological establishment in operation during World War II. Bletchley Park was where Alan Turing and other agents of the Ultra intelligence project decoded the enemy's secret messages, most notably those that had been encrypted with the German Enigma and Tunny cipher machines. Experts have suggested that the Bletchley Park codebreakers may have shortened the war by as much as two years.
