

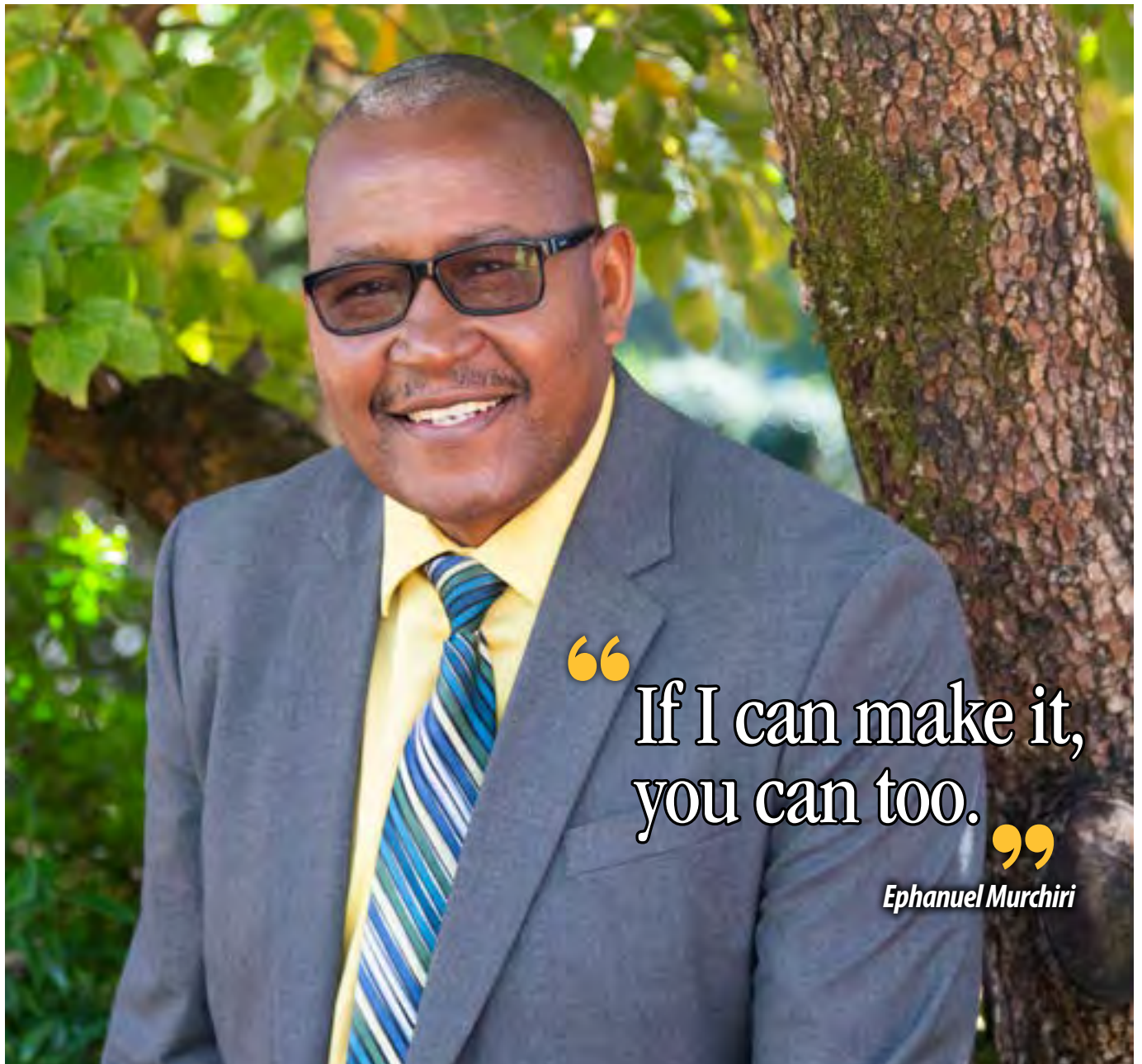

For Ephanuel Murchiri, the hurdles he has faced haven't discouraged him, instead they have presented opportunities for him to find a way to achieve his goals.

Born in Nairobi, Kenya, Ephanuel was 12 years old when he watched his mother perish for lack of simple medical treatment. He knew then he wanted to help others through medicine.



One of his earliest obstacles was attending high school, simply for lack of funds. A missionary chaplain helped him with funds to attend school. Upon graduation, he taught school, then attended seminary and became a Presbyterian minister. Through his ministry, he opened three medical clinics and had a weekly radio show.

His show was recognized in the U.S. and he was invited to come to New York in 2015. Still thinking about his medical goal, he took classes in science and math at the Allen School in Jamaica, N.Y.

In 2016, he visited Winston-Salem and decided he liked the climate much better than the cold in New York.

Once in Winston-Salem, he didn't hesitate to begin taking continuing education classes at our West Campus to earn his Nursing Assistant Certification. With that certification, he enrolled in the Medication Aide class. Having completed that class, he plans to take his prerequisites at Forsyth Tech to apply for the nursing program next fall.

While taking classes, he also mentored other refugees. He works part-time with World Relief as an interpreter and transports students to class, encouraging them to learn English through the English as a Second Language classes (ESL) at Forsyth Tech.
