

It's often the smallest suggestion that sparks an idea.

When Dwan Huffin graduated from Carver High School in 2017, he wasn't sure what he wanted to do. With a suggestion from his mentor, Huffin connected with a friend who works at Forsyth Tech. She told him

about the Production Technician Program (PTP) conducted in the Business and Industry Services Department of Forsyth Tech's Economic and Workforce Development Division. Huffin liked the idea and started the program in July.

Huffin's determination was the key to his success in class. For three weeks, Dwan rode the city bus every day, even making a bus transfer to get to school by 8 a.m. without a single tardy or absence.

"The PTP program gave me direction as I wasn't sure what I wanted to do after graduation," said Huffin. "I knew I wanted a break from school and didn't want to work in a fast food restaurant."

Barry Self, advanced manufacturing instructor, was Huffin's favorite and most inspirational instructor. He said that Self made sure the students understood all the principles and lessons presented before moving ahead.

When Preparation Meets Opportunity

When asked about Huffin, Self said, "I'm extremely proud of Dwan. This was an opportunity for a life-changing situation, plus he wanted to learn new things. Now, he has a good job as a Quality Inspector at Penn Engineering, right out of high school."

His supervisor, Quality and Shipping Manager Mike Bumgarner, said about Huffin, "He has a high degree of accuracy and precision. He was knowledgeable coming into the job because of his training in the PTP."

Penn Engineering was one of the companies invited to visit the PTP classes to talk with students about potential jobs once they have completed the program. Dwan was offered a job on the spot.



Refund Policy

A full refund is given if Forsyth Tech cancels a course.

If the course has a ✓ symbol, you may get a full refund of your tuition by officially withdrawing from the class before the first class meeting. After the class has started, a 75% refund can be obtained by officially withdrawing before the class has met 10% of its scheduled time.

If the course has a * symbol, you may get a full refund of your tuition by officially withdrawing from the class one working day (24 hours) before the first class meeting. No partial refunds will be given.
