Julie Gillett, EMS Instructor

Great sales people possess certain traits including insight, responsibility, confidence, empathy and good communication. Julie Gillett, after a 20-year career in retail sales, felt she had a good grasp of these skills and wanted to give back to her community. She now applies those talents as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT).



"I enjoyed working with people but felt there was more I could contribute," said Gillett. "While I was still working, I became a volunteer firefighter and worked for the Pinnacle Fire Department for two years."

Through that experience, Gillett discovered she preferred the medical response duties more than the fire response functions. She decided to go back to school for Emergency Medical Services (EMS) at the Northwest Center of Forsyth Tech in King.

"We see people on their worst day when they need medical assistance. I feel that we are making a difference in lives," said Gillett. As an emergency medical technician for Life Star Ambulance Service, Gillett works approximately 60-hours a week. In addition, she serves as an adjunct faculty member teaching the technical aspects of the standard practice for EMS students. Plus, Julie still volunteers on-call for the Pinnacle Fire Department.

Penni Swaim, coordinator of Emergency Medical Services at Forsyth Tech said, "When she completed her training, I knew not only had Julie mastered the skills but she had a way with people that made her an exceptional EMT. I asked her to come back and be an instructor." Gillett felt her sales training helped her tremendously in her work with EMS.

"Knowing how to talk with people and how I would want to be treated in those situations, makes me work hard to give people the care and compassion they need at that time. I enjoyed sales but I love what I'm doing now."

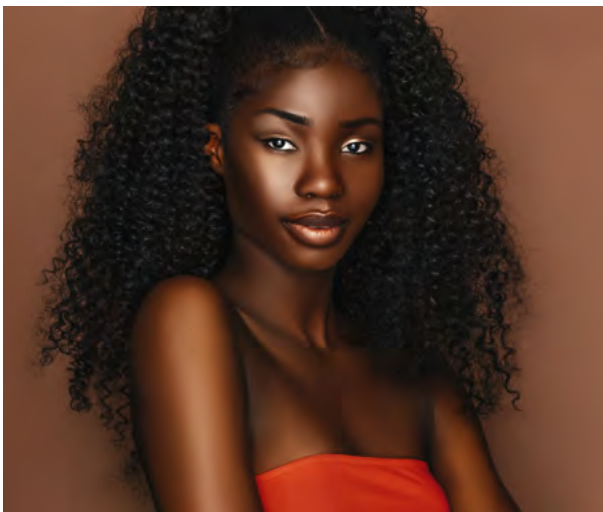
