In addition to classes, students are also required to intern at various places that offer broadcasting careers, according to Avery Colburn, 18, a Theatre Lighting Student working in the Broadcasting work study program. He continues to say, "I would say about 80% of students in the program go on to work where improved my skills [needed for] this they intern."
