In addition to the art gallery and the conference center, Phase Two includes the relocation of several student service departments from the Allman Center to the Oak Grove Center: Records, Student Success, and Admissions. The Engineering Technologies Dean's Office moved to Oak Grove, as well.

Several work and lab spaces were created during Phase Two.

The programs that have new space include HVAC, Horticul-

ture, Graphic Arts, Carpentry, Caterpillar, Plumbing, and Electrical.

Two other labs were also a part of Phase Two, the Science Skills Learning Lab and the brand new Early Childhood Lab School.






