Pencils

- Prismacolor Premier Colored Pencils. 'Assorted Colors' set of 36 (or more) is recommended because it includes the colors used in beginner exercises
- Graphite pencil (regular #2 yellow pencil or HB drawing pencil)
- Prismacolor 1077 colorless pencil (optional)

Paper

- 9" x 12" pad of Bristol board, Vellum or Smooth Surface, White (such as Strathmore 300 Series)

Pencil Sharpener

- Hand held is just fine (such as Prismacolor or Faber-Castell brand). But you can also use a battery powered or electric sharpener

Eraser

- White plastic (A conventional white plastic eraser is fine, but both Staedtler and Tombow make a refillable stick eraser that is useful for erasing details)
- Kneaded (used to erase details as well as larger areas)

Dusting Brush

- (optional) Either a dusting/drafting brush or inexpensive 4 inch paint brush from a hardware store. Used to get rid of eraser crumbs
