Pharmacy Technology Admissions At-A-Glance

- Two-year Associate in Applied Science degree program.
- A maximum of 20 new students are accepted each year (start date May 20, 2024).
- Students are admitted in the order they apply, as long as they meet the minimum GPA, English readiness, Math readiness, and Biology competency requirements.
- The MAR application opens each year in January.
- Until you are accepted to Pharmacy Technology, you will be enrolled in Associate in Arts-Health Tech Track. This track allows you to take some classes prior to the official program start date.

Steps for Applying to Pharmacy Technology

- 1. Complete an application to Forsyth Tech (if you are not a current student).
- 2. Check that you meet the minimum Math, English, and Biology requirements.
- 3. Submit official transcripts.
- 4. Schedule a Personalized Advising & Planning meeting with the Program Coordinator.
- 5. Submit the MAR application. (You may only apply to one (1) health program at a time.)
- 6. Review additional information for accepted students.

1. Apply to Forsyth Tech

New Students: You must apply for admission before completing the MAR application. Former Students: Reapply if it has been more than one year since you registered for classes. Current Students: Students registered for classes, do not need a new Admissions application. ALL APPLICANTS should ensure their state residency determination is up to date.

2. Verify that you meet the minimum readiness requirements

Pharmacy Tech applicants must demonstrate readiness for college-level English, Math, and Biology. Your advisor can help you determine if you meet the readiness requirements.

A minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average is required for admission to Pharmacy Tech. Students who meet the English Readiness, Math Readiness, Biology Competency, and GPA requirements are eligible to submit a MAR application for Pharmacy Technology.

3. Submit official transcripts (and/or AP scores)

Electronic transcripts directly from a school or transcript company can be sent through a secure service to <u>admissions@forsythtech.edu</u>. Transcripts emailed by the student are not accepted.

I haven't requested my high school or GED transcript yet. Do I really need to have it sent?	If you are planning to apply for financial aid, you will need your high school or GED transcript on file. We also review your transcripts to determine if you meet any English, math, or science readiness requirements. After you are accepted into your program, transcripts may be needed for some clinical sites and accreditation requirements.
I have attended two or more colleges. I already sent my transcript from College B and it shows all the classes I took at College A. Do I have to send the transcript from College A? 4. Complete a Pre-Program Advising and Planning Meeting

To learn specifics about the program, you are strongly encouraged to schedule a pre-program advising and planning meeting. The meeting will be personalized and informative. You may ask questions about class scheduling, program costs, clinical requirements, and more.

For students who are already employed or have pharmacy tech certification, this meeting will help you determine if you may be eligible to receive credit for prior learning.

5. Submit the MAR Application

What to expect after submitting the application

• A confirmation message will be shown on the screen after you submit your application.

- We will communicate using your Forsyth Tech email address. Check your email daily and ensure that your phone number is updated.
- Advisors typically begin reviewing applications AFTER the priority deadline. If we review your application before the deadline, you will receive an email with a summary of your qualifications. This email will NOT indicate if you were admitted. It will only let you know that we have reviewed your application.
- It may take up to six (6) weeks after the MAR application deadline, before you are notified regarding your admission status. The email you receive will indicate if you are:
 - Admitted: read your letter carefully and follow all additional requirements.
 - Alternate: read your letter carefully and respond if requested. Continue to check your email and phone messages daily.
 - Not admitted: you may schedule an appointment with your advisor to discuss ways to become more competitive for the next application cycle.

General Education/Related Courses for Pharmacy Technology

Associate in Arts-Health Tech Track (AA-HT) is the correct program for students who plan to apply to Pharmacy Technology. The AA-HT program allows you to take the general education courses for your degree, and it lets us know that you intend to apply to one of the health science programs. If you have not met the minimum English, math, or science readiness requirements, you will take the needed courses while in AA-HT.

Listed below are the general education/related courses for Health Information Technology:

You are not required to take these courses prior to submitting your MAR application. They provide an opportunity for you to get a head start on your degree requirements. If you do not complete them before you apply to Pharmacy Tech, you can take them while in the program.

**ENG-011 and MAT 043 may be required co-requisites for some students in order to meet college readiness before applying to the program (Readiness, page 2).

^ENG 115 and PSY 118 are not eligible for financial aid for students in the Associate in Arts-Health Tech Track. Select one of the other courses listed for that category.

6. Additional Information for Accepted Students

Program Orientation

Orientation is scheduled for the first night of Pharmacy Technolgy classes, May 20, 2024. Accepted students will receive an email with the time and location. During orientation, students will register for classes, and learn about program policies and the <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>.

Academic Progression

Students enrolled in Pharmacy Tech must earn a final grade of 78 or higher in all PHM courses to remain eligible for graduation requirements.

Clinical Requirements

Students admitted to Pharmacy Technology will be required to meet additional clinical requirements to maintain their seat in the program. These requirements include a physical health assessment and required vaccinations for a clinical practicum. Accepted students will receive the necessary paperwork, instructions, and deadlines during the program orientation.

Background Clearance

Clinical agencies require criminal background checks and/or drug screening for students assigned to their facility for clinical education. In addition, national and/or state registry and/or licensure boards **may prohibit** eligibility for registry or licensure based on criminal background records.

Deferred Action Childhood Arrival (DACA) and Undocumented Students Policy

Current NCCCS policy allows DACA and undocumented applicants to enroll at Forsyth Tech at the out of state tuition cost. However, acceptance to the college does not guarantee acceptance to a specific program.

DACA students are eligible to apply to an Allied Health/Nursing program. Undocumented students are not eligible for consideration to Allied Health or Nursing programs. According to North Carolina and Federal law, undocumented students are not eligible for North Carolina professional licensure.
