The program is aligned with ASE standards and is designed to prepare students for both Toyota certifications and ASE exams.

Licensure and Certification: Licensure is not generally required to work as a Toyota technician; however, ASE certification is widely recognized and strongly encouraged. Toyota-specific credentials may also be required by dealerships. Students should review any additional requirements in their state related to emissions or refrigerant systems.
