The EMT program at Forsyth Technical Community College provides students with the essential knowledge and hands-on skills needed to deliver life-saving care in emergency situations. Through a combination of classroom instruction, lab sessions, and clinical experiences, students learn foundational airway management, pharmacology, patient assessment, trauma care, obstetrics, and CPR. Graduates who successfully complete the course and pass the certification exam are eligible to work in a variety of settings, including 911 emergency and backup response, convalescent transport, critical care transport, emergency departments, urgent care centers, and other clinical environments.

Upon completion of the program, students are eligible to sit for both the North Carolina State EMT and the National Registry Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT) exam. While the National Registry (NR) certification is recognized in other states, each state may have specific requirements or endorsement processes. Students planning to practice outside North Carolina should consult the appropriate state EMS agency for guidance.
